## The Wisdom Of God

## Overview

In last week's sermon, Aaron expounds upon the inscrutable wisdom of God, which has been concealed within a mystery predetermined before the ages, beyond the reach of human intellect alone. In our text, Paul underscores the significance of attentive listening to preaching and and relying on the power of the Holy Spirit to reveal to us the plan of God's great salvation. Paul further reminds us that, through the gospel, we have been granted the incomparable privilege of possessing the mind of Christ, an opportunity extended to us even before the foundation of the earth. Consequently, we ought to pay attention to preaching and seek the Holy Spirit's illumination to unveil the truth about God's plan for redemption.

- 7. Why is it important to pay attention to preaching and the Word of God?
- 8. How can you maintain a consistent and patient approach to evangelism, as emphasized by Pastor Aaron's sermon on the need for faithful witnesses and regularly sharing the gospel with non-believers? Additionally, what improvements do you think FBC can make to enhance their outreach efforts and better reach those who have not yet heard the gospel message?
